The Bankruptcy Clinic

The clinic offers a free class which covers the basics of filing for chapter 7 bankruptcy and legal consultations for qualified individuals to discuss their case with a volunteer attorney. ***The clinic is currently operating remotely.**

Appointments with a free attorney-All of the attorneys and judges involved in the clinic volunteer their time, services are provided at no charge. The attorney will review your case and tell you if bankruptcy would help. If bankruptcy would be appropriate for your situation, the attorney may represent you in your bankruptcy. Limited number of appointments available.

What kind of cases does the bankruptcy clinic accept ?

The bankruptcy clinic is for people who are interested in filing Chapter 7 bankruptcy. A Chapter 7 bankruptcy discharges the debtor’s debts in exchange for giving up property that is not exempt.

Who can get help at the clinic?

Appointments with volunteer attorneys are available for low-income individuals with limited assets who live in Clackamas, Columbia, Hood River, Multnomah, Wasco, Washington, and Yamhill Counties.

To schedule an appointment, call Legal Aid Services of Oregon 503-224-4086. Our staff will do an initial intake with you to see if you meet our program’s eligibility requirements.

About Legal Aid Services of Oregon (LASO)

LASO is a non-profit law firm that provides free legal services to low-income Oregonians in civil (non-criminal) matters – Most clients must be eligible under the federal poverty income guidelines. Due to limited resources, we are unable to provide legal assistance to all eligible individuals. We accept cases based upon the availability of staff, the strength of your case, and our office’s current priorities.
